Citizen Comments: Sheriff Beth asked that benefits (i.e. 10% contribution towards medical insurance premiums) not be negotiated separately for the 5 or 6 elected officials. He asked that elected officials be grouped in with other non-represented employees or with the groups that they are supervising.

Supervisor Comments: None

Chairman Comments: Supr. Huff reported that he was in receipt of a decision regarding adult entertainment licensing. He will distribute copies to Committee members. He also reported that he attended a Justice Coordinator Seminar relating to streamlining communications/problems amongst agencies including Courts, Sheriff, Social Services, etc. Streamlining issues within the community were also discussed.

Resolutions from the Kenosha County Sheriff's Department:

1) Cabaret License – Tarbender's Bar and Grill

Captain Apker explained that this is conversion from a probationary license to a regular license. There were no incidences at the establishment during the probationary period.

2) Cabaret License – 75th Street Inn

This is another conversion to a regular license. Capt. Apker reported that the only incidence during the probationary period was an anonymous call for underage drinking that turned out to be unfounded.

3) Daimler – Chrysler Corporation Fund Grant

KSD was asked to apply for this \$2,500 grant from the Daimler-Chrysler Corporation Fund. The funds will be used to purchase equipment to support the build-up and operation of the K-9 units. Two dogs and two officers have been trained for the canine units. Two vehicles are in; they are awaiting some equipment. The units will focus on traffic interdiction with drug search. No matching funds or additional tax levy dollars are needed.
