



Inventory of Community Facilities

City and County Municipal Buildings, Post Offices, Libraries, and Museums

- The City of Kenosha Municipal Building is located in the east-central portion of the City (52nd Street and 6th Avenue)
- City of Kenosha Public Works Building is located on 35th Avenue.
- Kenosha County Courthouse and Kenosha County Administration Building are also located in the City of Kenosha, along with the Kemper Center and 3 other County buildings.
- There are 3 U.S. Post Office facilities: one on Sheridan Road, one on 80th Street, and one on 52nd Street.
- The City has 4 public libraries: Northside Kenosha Public Library; Simmons Kenosha Public Library; Southwest Kenosha Public Library; and Uptown Kenosha Public Library.
- The Kenosha Public Museum and the Dinosaur Discovery Museum are located in downtown Kenosha.

Police, Fire Protection, and Emergency Rescue Services

Police protection in the City of Kenosha is provided by the City of Kenosha Police Department, which provides service 24 hours a day. Fire protection is provided by the City of Kenosha Fire Department, which consists of 7 fire stations located throughout the City. Emergency medical service units associated with 4 of the fire stations provide emergency rescue service in the City.

Schools

- Elementary and high school students living in the City east of I-94 are in the Kenosha Unified School District (KUSD). KUSD operates 37 schools east of the Interstate, including:
 - 24 pre-kindergarten, kindergarten and elementary schools
 - 7 middle schools
 - 6 high schools
- West of I-94, elementary students are in the Paris Joint School District or the Bristol School District, and high school students are in the Westosha Central High School District. Currently, there are no schools located west of the I-94 in the City.
- There are 15 private schools in the City, including:
 - 13 pre-kindergarten, kindergarten and elementary schools
 - 1 middle school (St. Joseph Junior High School)
 - 1 high school (St. Joseph High School)

Cemeteries

There are 4 cemeteries in the City of Kenosha, encompassing about 78 acres in total: Greenridge Cemetery, Vale Cemetery, St. George Cemetery, and St. James Cemetery.

Health Care Facilities

There are 3 hospitals located in the City of Kenosha: Aurora Medical Center, Children's Hospital of Wisconsin, and United Hospital System-Kenosha Medical Center Campus. The City also has 6 clinics for non-specialized medical services: Aurora Health Center; Family Medical Center North; Family Practice Associates; Kenosha Community Health Center; Kenosha Pediatrics; Sheridan Medical Complex.

Child Care Facilities

Child care facilities in the City of Kenosha include 39 licensed group child care centers (serving 9 or more children) and 36 licensed family child care centers (serving 4-8 children).
