



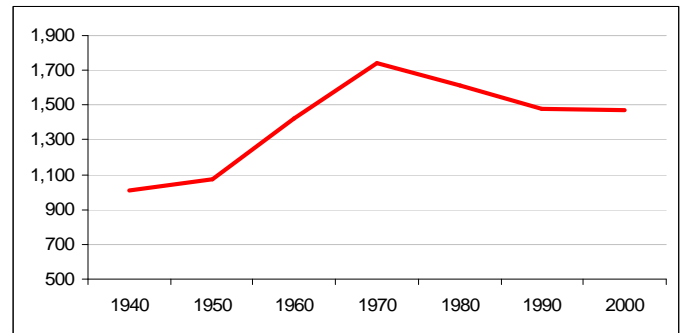

Population Trends

Between 1940 and 2000, the Town of Paris grew from 1,006 people to 1,473 – an overall increase of 467 persons, or about 46%. (This compares with increases of 136% in Kenosha County, 81% in the Southeast Region, and 71% statewide during the same time period.)

Age Distribution

In the Town of Paris, the median age in 2000 was about 40 years.

- About 27% of residents were under the age of 20.
- About 59% were between the ages of 20 and 64.
- About 14% were 65 or older.

Racial Composition

In 2000, the Town of Paris population consisted of:

- 98% White
- 0.3% Black or African American
- 0.3% Asian
- 0.1% American Indian or Alaskan Native
- 0.9% Multi-Racial

Due to Federal definitions, Hispanics are not considered a racial group, but rather, an ethnic one. In 2000, 20 persons (1.4% of the population) were Hispanic.

Educational Attainment

In 2000, of the Town of Paris residents at least 25 years old:

- 86% were high school graduates.
- 45% had attended some college or earned an associate, bachelor, or graduate degree.
