Inventory of Land Uses: 2005

Urban Land Uses

3,943 acres, or 18% of the Town of Bristol, were developed with urban land uses.

Residential

2,390 acres (11% of the Town) were in residential uses, including:

- 96% were single-family homes
- Less than 1% were two-family dwellings
- 2% were multi-family dwellings
- Less than 2% were mobile homes

Transportation, Communications and Utilities

945 acres (4% of the Town) were transportation, communications and utilities, including:

- 863 acres (4% of the Town) were streets and highways
- 83 acres (less than 1% of the Town) were communications, utilities, and other transportation facilities

Recreational

Intensive recreational land includes only those parks or portions of parks that have been developed with buildings or facilities such as playgrounds, tennis courts, baseball diamonds, and soccer fields. 192 acres (less than 1% of the Town) were in recreational uses.

Commercial, Industrial, and Government and Institutional

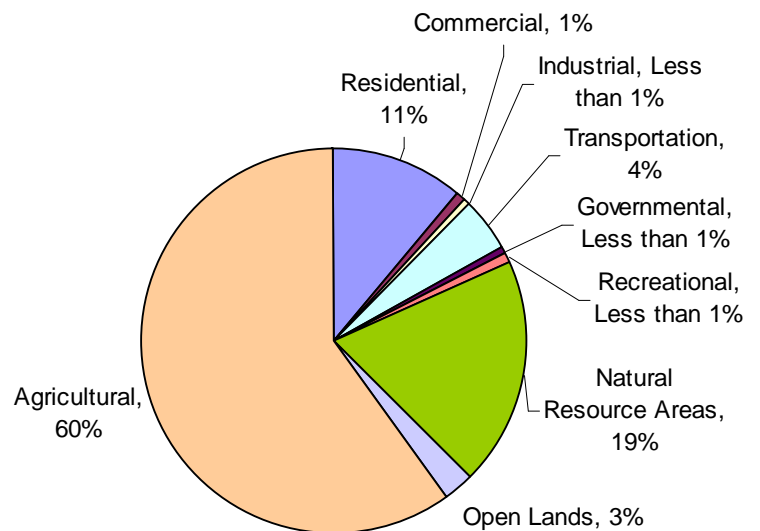
- 192 acres (1% of the Town) were commercial uses.
- 101 acres (less than 1% of the Town) were industrial uses.
- 124 acres (less than 1% of the Town) were governmental and institutional uses.

Nonurban Land Uses

17,449 acres, 82% of the Town of Bristol, were in agricultural or other nonurban land uses, including:

- 12,828 acres (60% of the Town of Bristol) were agricultural
- 4,064 acres (19%) were natural resource areas such as rivers, streams, woodlands, and wetlands
- 556 acres (3%) were open lands
