Inventory of Utilities

Sanitary Sewer Service

The Town of Bristol is served by:

- Town of Bristol Utility District No. 1 – the sewer service area associated with this district encompassed 2,125 acres in 2006; about 580 acres were served by the District in 2000 in the Bristol hamlet area and around George Lake.
- Town of Salem Utility District No. 2 – the sewer service area associated with this district encompassed 60 acres in 2006; about 52 acres were served by the District in 2000 around Lake Shangrila
- Town of Bristol Utility District No. 3 – the sewer service area associated with this district encompassed 1,695 acres in 2006; about 90 acres were served by the District in 2000 near the IH94 and STH 50 interchange

Kenosha County regulates private on-site wastewater treatment systems (POWTS) for any development that is not served by public sanitary sewer. Between 1980 and 2006, permits for 478 POWTS were issued for such systems in the Town of Bristol.

Water Supply

- In 2005, the Town of Bristol Utility District No. 1 provided public water to residents and businesses located in a 430 acre service area in the northwestern portion of the Town. Utility District No. 1 provides treated groundwater to its customers.
- In 2005, the Town of Bristol Utility District No. 3 provided public water to residents and businesses located in a 90 acre service area in the northeastern portion of the Town. Utility District No. 3 purchases treated Lake Michigan water from the Kenosha Water Utility as its water source.
- In 2005, residential customers in both Districts consumed an average of about 67 gallons of water per person per day.

Outside of the two water utility districts, water for domestic and other uses in the Town of Bristol is supplied by groundwater through the use of private wells.

Stormwater Management

Stormwater drains mostly through natural watercourses, roadside swales, culverts, and detention and retention basins.

Electrical Power and Natural Gas

We Energies provides electric power and natural gas services throughout the Town of Bristol.

Telecommunications Service

Wireless antennas providing wireless cell phone service in the Town of Bristol include: Cingular, Nextel, and U.S. Cellular. In 2005, there were 4 wireless antenna towers in the Town: 3 accommodated antennas for two companies and 1 accommodated antennas for a single carrier.

Solid Waste Management Facilities

The Town of Bristol contracts with John's Disposal to provide curbside pick-up of solid waste and recyclable materials for residents. Solid waste collected from the Town of Bristol is deposited in the Pheasant Run Landfill in the Town of Paris. The landfill is owned by Waste Management, Inc., and has a total capacity of 21.4 million cubic yards. As of 2006, there were 4.1 million cubic remaining, or an estimated three additional years of activity at its current capacity and use. A proposed expansion of the landfill is currently being reviewed by regulatory authorities, including Kenosha County.
