Streets and Highways

Arterial Streets and Highways

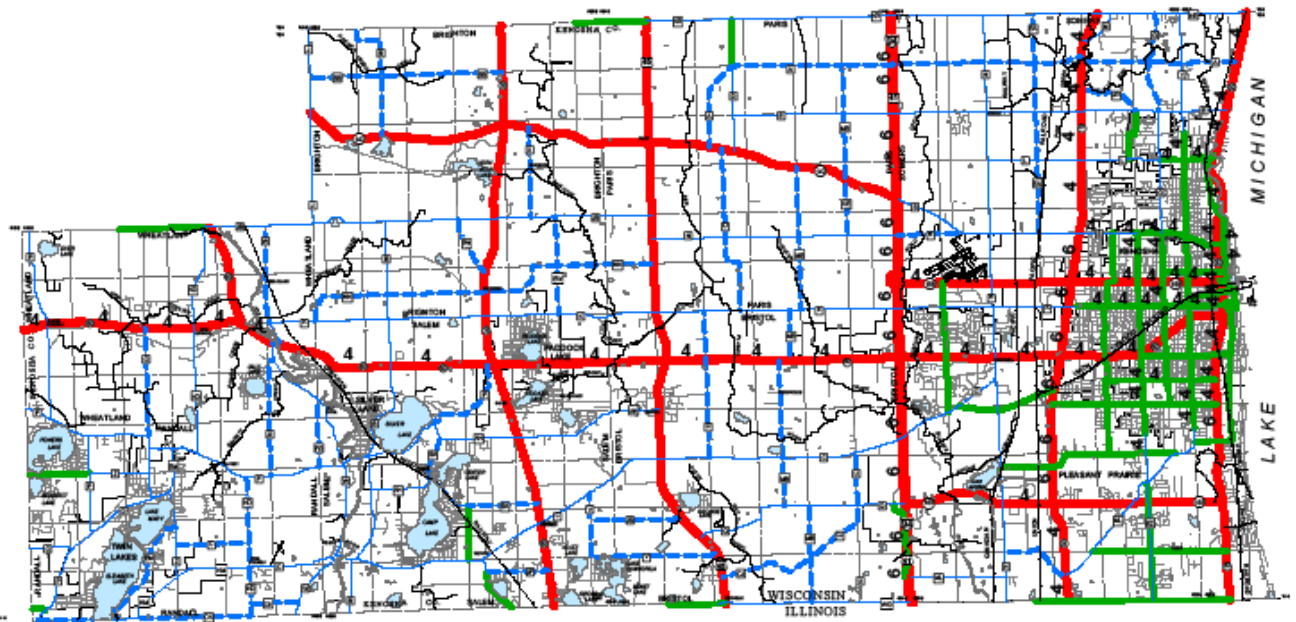
In 2006, there were approximately 37 miles of arterial streets and highways in the Town of Bristol. (Arterial streets and highways carry traffic between communities and to destinations beyond the County.)

- 14.5 miles of arterial highways in the Town in 2006 were under the jurisdiction of the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, including 3.1 miles of freeway.
- 20.6 miles of arterial highways were under the jurisdiction of Kenosha County.
- 2.0 miles of arterial streets were under the jurisdiction of the Town of Bristol.

Collector and Land Access Streets

- In 2006, there were approximately 36.7 miles of collector and land access streets in the Town of Bristol, including 16.9 miles of non-arterial highways under the jurisdiction of Kenosha County.

Public Transportation Services

Local Transit: Fixed-Route

The City of Kenosha transit system includes seven regular bus routes emanating from downtown Kenosha with service from downtown to all portions of the City and its immediate environs, including areas of the Town adjacent to the City of Kenosha. In addition, there is a bus route that provides local transit service directly to Southport Plaza and Factory Outlet Center in the Town of Bristol.

Other Transportation Facilities and Services

Specialized Transportation Services

Kenosha Care-A-Van and the Volunteer Escort Service (both provided by Kenosha County Department of Human Services) offer door-to-door transportation services to individuals who are elderly, disabled or assessed as unable to use other transit services.

Rail Freight Services

Rail freight service in Kenosha County includes three railway companies (Union Pacific Railway, Canadian Pacific Railway, and Canadian National Railway) over approximately 50 miles of track. There is no freight rail service in the Town of Bristol.

Airports

There are five privately-owned and privately-used airports (Bristol, Chilcott Farms, Dutch Gap Airstrip, Thompson Strawberry Farm, and Winfield) and one privately-owned and privately-used heliport in the Town. General passenger service is provided by General Mitchell International Airport in Milwaukee County. Public-use airports in Kenosha County include the Kenosha Regional Airport, Westosha Airport, Camp Lake Airport, and Vincent Airport.
