Inventory of Land Uses: 2005

Urban Land Uses

2,416 acres, or 16% of the Town of Wheatland, were developed with urban land uses.

Residential

1,477 acres (10% of the Town) were in residential uses, of which:

- 98% were single-family homes
- 2% were mobile homes
- Less than 1% were two-family dwellings
- Less than 1% were multi-family dwellings

Transportation, Communications and Utilities

733 acres (5% of the Town of Wheatland) were transportation, communications and utilities, including 687 acres (4.5% of the Town) of streets and highways, and 37 acres (less than 1% of the Town) of railroads.

Recreational

Intensive recreational land includes only those parks or portions of parks that have been developed with buildings or facilities such as playgrounds, tennis courts, baseball diamonds, and soccer fields. 87 acres (1% of the Town) were in recreational uses.

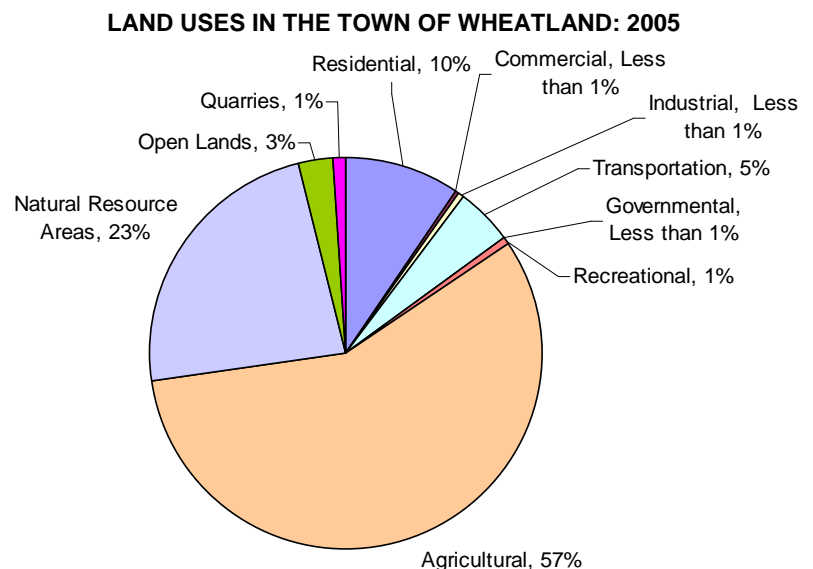
Commercial, Industrial, and Government and Institutional

- 38 acres (less than 1% of the Town) were commercial uses.
- 49 acres (less than 1% of the Town) were industrial uses.
- 32 acres (less than 1% of the Town) were governmental and institutional uses.

Nonurban Land Uses

13,001 acres, 84% of the Town, were in agricultural or other nonurban land uses, of which:

- 8,810 acres (57% of the Town) were agricultural
- 3,610 acres (23%) were natural resource areas such as rivers, streams, woodlands, and wetlands
- 175 acres (1%) were quarries
- 406 acres (3%) were open lands
