Inventory of Land Uses: 2005

Urban Land Uses

493 acres, or 57% of the Village of Silver Lake, were developed with urban land uses.

Residential

298 acres (34% of the Village of Silver Lake) were in residential uses, of which:

- 93% were single-family homes
- Less than 1% were two-family dwellings
- 4% were multi-family dwellings
- 2% were mobile homes

Transportation, Communications and Utilities

149 acres (17% of the Village) were transportation, communications and utilities, of which:

- 124 acres (14% of the Village) were street and highway rights-of-way
- 20 acres (2% of the Village) were railroad rights-of-way
- 4 acres (less than 1% of the Village) were communications, utilities, and other transportation

Recreational

Intensive recreational land includes only those parks or portions of parks that have been developed with buildings or facilities such as playgrounds, tennis courts, baseball diamonds, and soccer fields. 7 acres (1% of the Village of Silver Lake) were in recreational uses.

Commercial, Industrial, and Government and Institutional

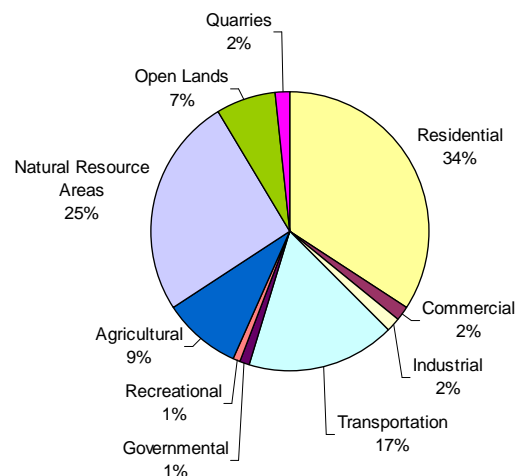
- 14 acres (2% of the Village) were commercial uses.
- 15 acres (2% of the Village) were industrial uses.
- 11 acres (1% of the Village) were governmental and institutional uses.

Nonurban Land Uses

377 acres, 43% of the Village of Silver Lake, were in agricultural or other nonurban land uses, including:

- 80 acres (9% of the Village of Silver Lake) were agricultural
- 222 acres (25%) were natural resource areas such as surface waters, woodlands, and wetlands
- 14 acres (2%) were quarries
- 61 acres (7%) were open lands
