Inventory of Natural Resources

Natural Resources

In 2000, the Village of Silver Lake included 1 acre of surface water, 176 acres of wetlands, and 59 acres of woodlands.

Critical Species Habitat Sites

There are no critical species habitats or aquatic habitat areas in the Village of Silver Lake. However, Silver Lake, adjacent to the Village, is considered an aquatic habitat area, encompassing 464 acres.

Park and Open Space Sites

- In 2006, the Village of Silver Lake contained approximately 65 acres of park and open space land, including:
 - 11 public sites (totaling 56 acres)
 - 1 school district site (totaling 4 acres)
 - 4 private sites (totaling 5 acres)
- County-owned sites in the Village include part of the Fox River Flood Mitigation Open Space Lands (83 acres altogether)
- State-owned sites in the Village include part of the Silver Lake Marsh (38 acres).
